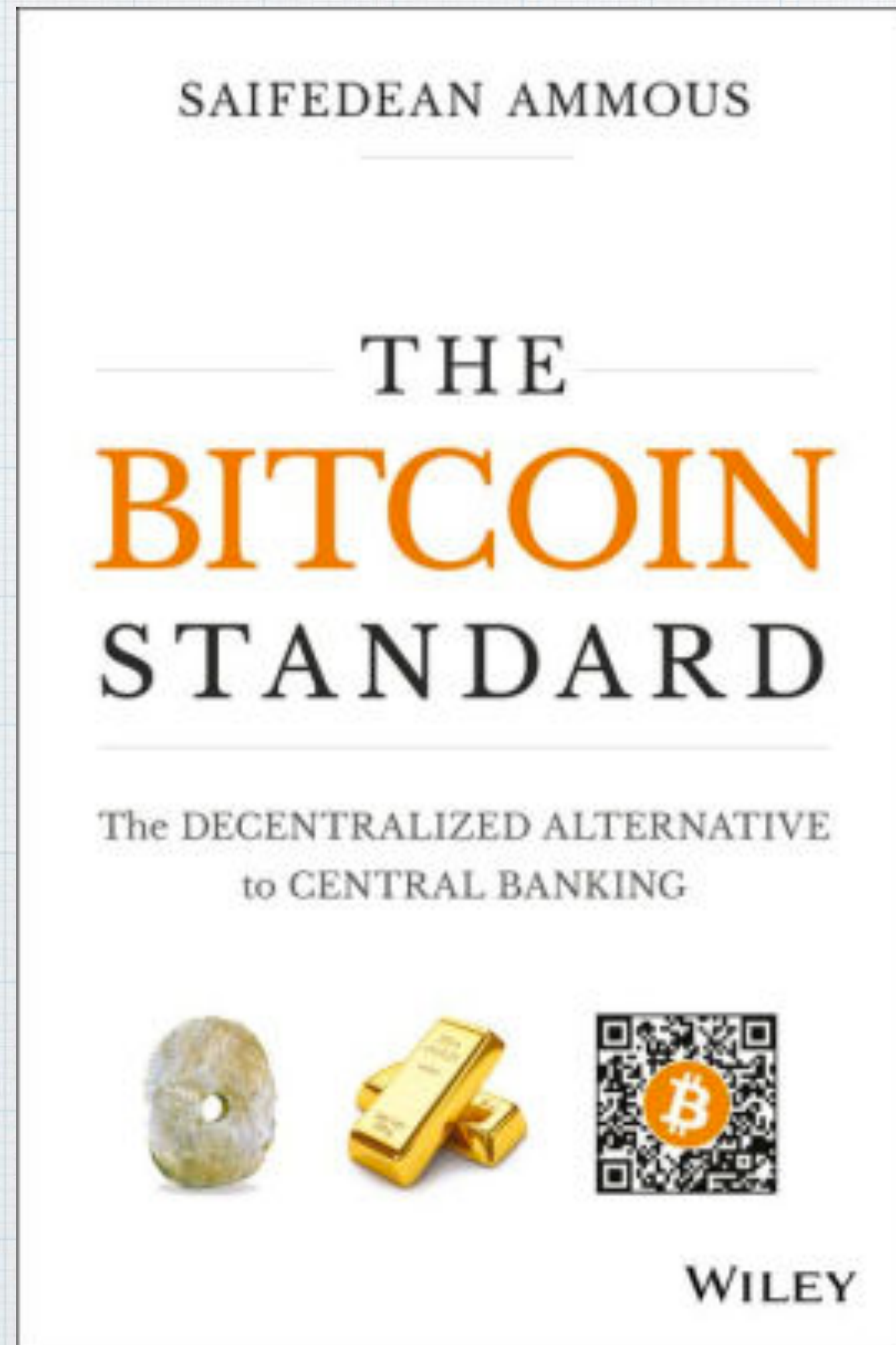

Bitcoin Beginnings

- * Bitcoin whitepaper written by **Satoshi Nakamoto** was released 31 October 2008
- * His real identity remains unknown
- * Software was released on 12 January 2009
- * Cypherpunk Hal Finney downloaded the software on this date and received 10 bitcoin
- * The first commercial transaction was by Laszlo Hanyecz who bought two Papa John's pizzas for 10,000 bitcoin

Bitcoin: A Peer-to-Peer Electronic Cash System

Abstract. A purely peer-to-peer version of electronic cash would allow online payments to be sent directly from one party to another without going through a financial institution. Digital signatures provide part of the solution, but the main benefits are lost if a trusted third party is still required to prevent double-spending. We propose a solution to the double-spending problem using a peer-to-peer network. The network timestamps transactions by hashing them into an ongoing chain of hash-based proof-of-work, forming a record that cannot be changed without redoing the proof-of-work. The longest chain not only serves as proof of the sequence of events witnessed, but proof that it came from the largest pool of CPU power. As long as a majority of CPU power is controlled by nodes that are not cooperating to attack the network, they'll generate the longest chain and outpace attackers. The network itself requires minimal structure. Messages are broadcast on a best effort basis, and nodes can leave and rejoin the network at will, accepting the longest proof-of-work chain as proof of what happened while they were gone.

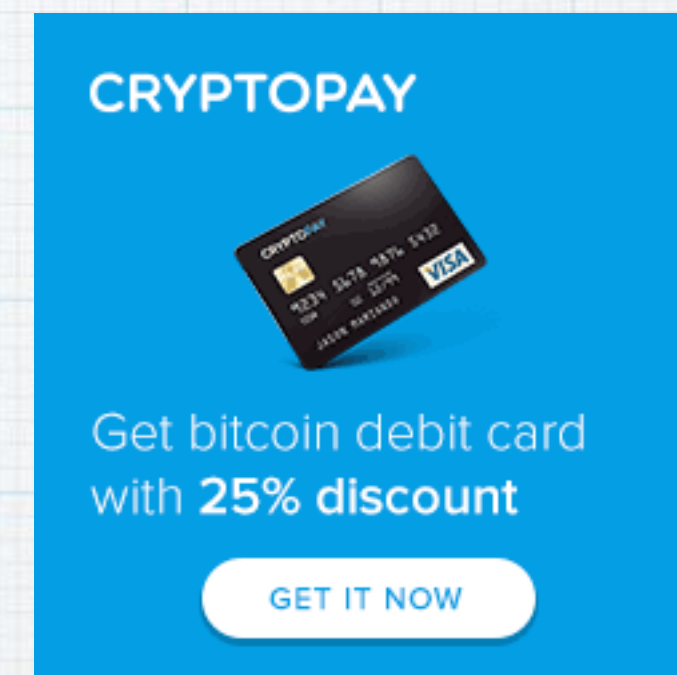

Where Does Bitcoin Come From?

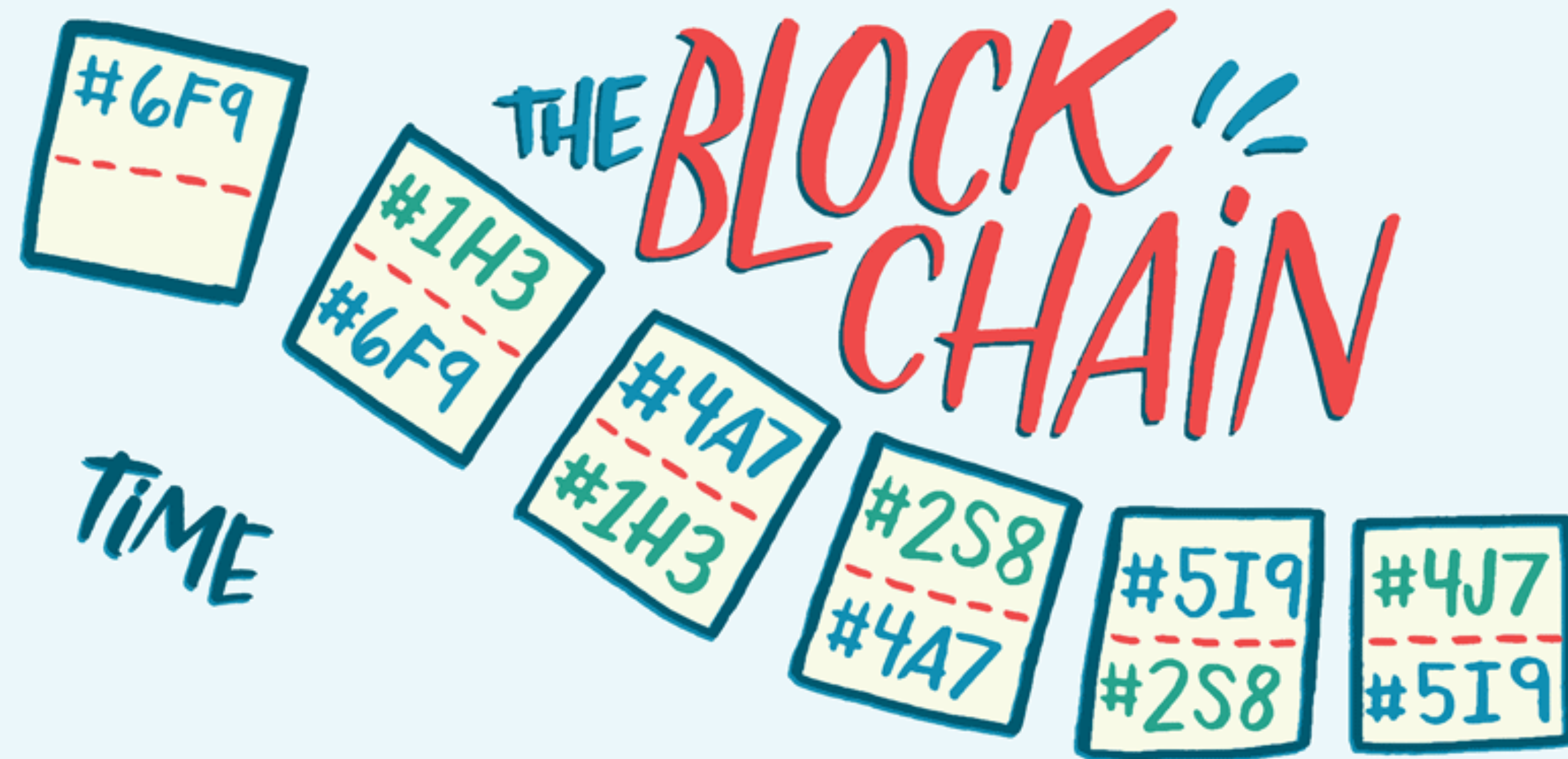
- * Its forged in fire!
- * It's created based on a schedule
- * Bitcoins start as rewards given to miners for validating transactions and maintaining the network
- * From there, they're spent and traded on the open market.



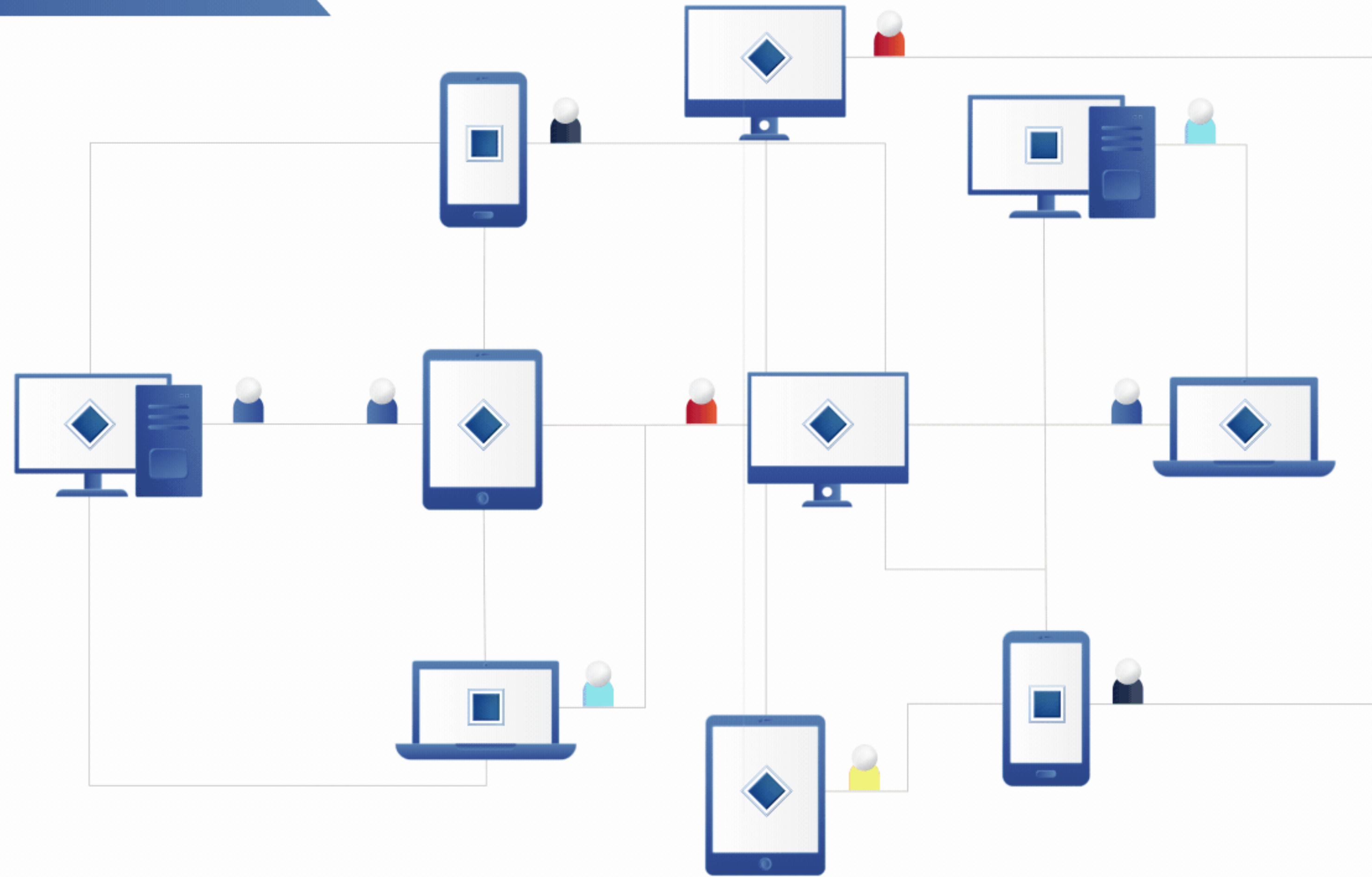
Bitcoin Supply

- * The rate at which new bitcoins are created is algorithmically cut in half roughly every 4 years (210,000 blocks)
- * Bitcoin has gone through two halvings to date; in November 2012, and again in July 2016.
- * The next halving will be in approximately 26 days
- * Blocks are generated every 10 minutes on average
 - * Starting at 50 new bitcoins per block when the system was launched in 2009,
 - * This creates a very well-defined supply curve.
- * The stability of Bitcoin's monetary policy a key differentiator versus other crypto assets.

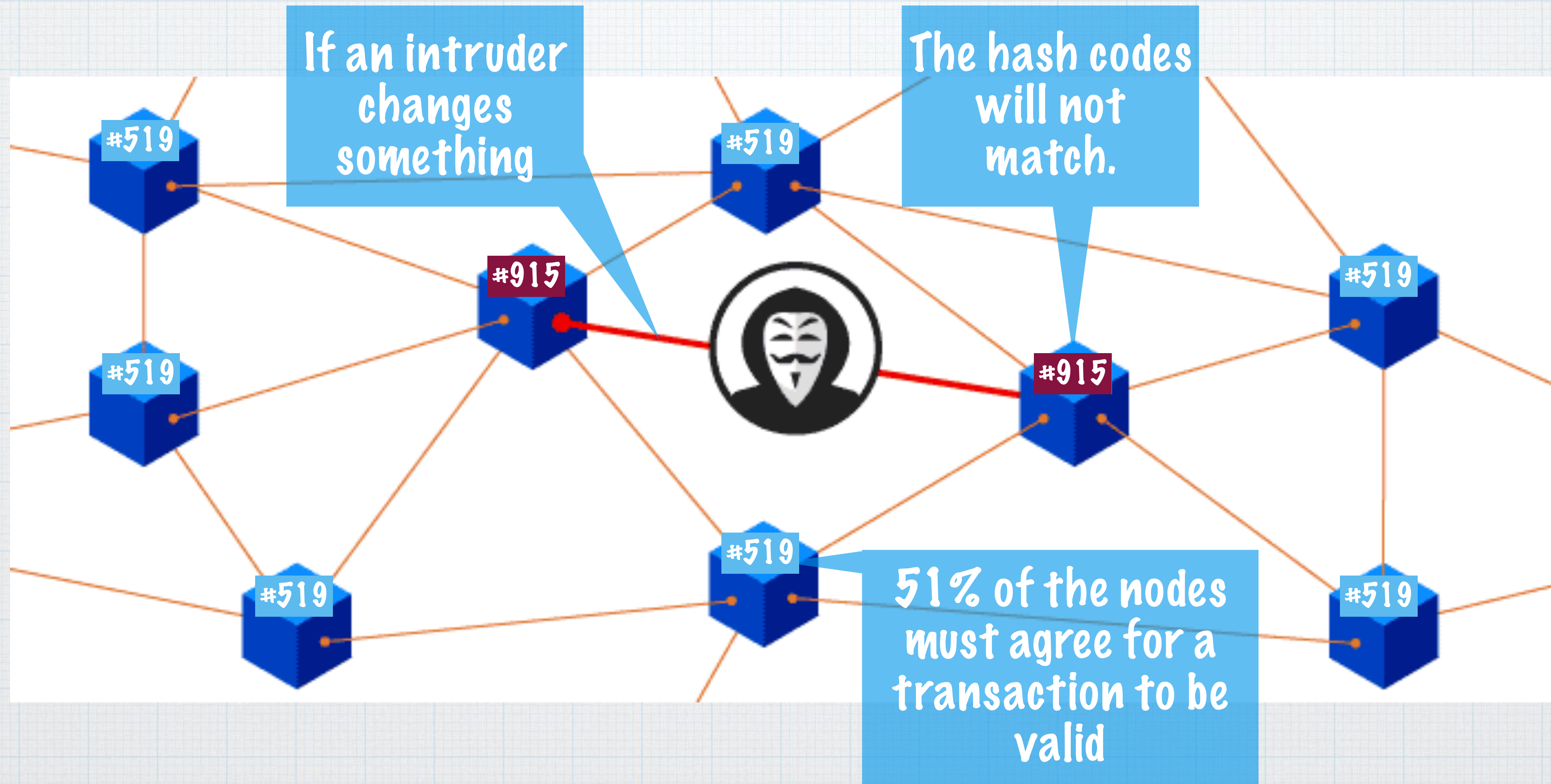
